Who can be a vendor?

- Virtually anyone
 - Corporations
 - Non-profit Organizations
 - Independent Contractors

- Register to Bid for goods/commodities through the “Vendor Self Service” and use in conjunction with Maine PTAC’s BidMatch service

- Watch for Service RFPs in local publications and your BidMatch subscription
