CAGE Code: Commercial and Government Entity
A DoD coding system which uses a unique 5 character alphanumeric code, assigned to each SAM registered government or business entity.

CLIN: Contract Line Item Number; sequential four digit numbers assigned to separately priced items in a solicitation (0001, 0002, etc.)

A number created by you when you register in SAM, a personal code that allows you to access other government applications such as the Past Performance Information Retrieval System (PIRS). The MPIN acts as your password in other systems.

A coding system of business size designations for all types of business establishments.

An alpha-numeric code of the Federal Procurement Data System, grouping common types of services.
